

Outstanding American



There's a doctor in the house, and he has been inducted into the New Jersey Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame as an Outstanding American.

Dr. Michael Deehan, the primary physician for the New Jersey State High School Wrestling Championships since 1996, was a four-year wrestler at Princeton University after a successful career at Seton Hall Prep. He also coached at Seton Hall University for one season.

He was a three-time District 13 champion, a two-time Region 3 champion and three-time finalist, and reached the state semi-finals in 1979.

After achieving a Bachelor of Science in Biology from Princeton University, he received his doctorate from University of Medicine and Dentistry, New Jersey, where he also completed an internship in general surgery and a residency in orthopedic surgery.

An orthopedic surgeon, he is the school physician at Hackettstown and Mt. Olive high schools and an orthopedic consultant at Blair Academy and Seton Hall Prep.


Deehan is a diplomat of the National Board of Medical Examiners, and a board member of the NJ Orthopedic Society. He is also a town health officer in Mansfield Township, an orthopedic surgeon in private practice in Hackettstown, was an assistant team physician at Kean University for a couple of years.

In 1994 he was inducted into the Seton Hall Prep Hall of Fame, and has also been a recipient of Residents' Award for outstanding paper presentation at the state Orthopedic Society's annual meeting.

A medical staff secretary/treasurer at Hackettstown Community Hospital, his hospital affiliations include Hackettstown Medical Center, Morristown Memorial Hospital, and Emmaus Surgical Center in Hackettstown.

A doctor of multiple sports at Blair, Mt. Olive and Hackettstown, wrestlers throughout the state come to his office for evaluations and treatment of wrestling injuries.

Residing in Long Valley, he and his wife Catherine are parents have four children: Elizabeth, Michael, Matthew and Emily.



Darryl Burley



Darryl Burley needed only one statistic for induction into New Jersey's Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. During his career at Lehigh University he reached the NCAA finals all four years. Since the NCAA Division I tournament began in 1947, only 17 wrestlers have accomplished that. Only four wrestlers have been four-time champions.

He finished as a two-time national champion, with only 5 losses in 100 career matches. During that time he also won a Midlands Tournament title (selected Outstanding Wrestler), as well as finishing second twice and third once.

Burley also won four EIWA titles, just one of four Lehigh wrestlers to do so.

A three-time District champion at Pemberton High School, he went on to win two region titles and as a senior in 1979 was a state champion while being voted OW.

In 1978 he took second place in the Junior Nationals in freestyle, in 1982 took fifth place in the AAU Nationals, in 1984 placed second at the US National Open as well as taking third place in the US Olympic Trails. In 1985 he won the US National Open.

In 1983 Burley was selected Amateur Wrestler of the Year. He is in both the Lehigh University Hall of Fame and the South Jersey Wrestling Hall of Fame.


He would go on to graduate from the Hofstra University School of Law, and has since coached at various wrestling clubs in Pennsylvania and New Jersey, including the Wrecking Crew Wrestling Club in Medford, NJ.


Currently he is a substitute teacher and assistant coach at the Cannon School in Concord, NC, and been a clinician at various university and high school camps.

Burley has also worked in the private sector, having designed, developed and implemented vocational and acute nursing skilled facilities, geared towards individuals with developmental and medical disabilities.

He is the father of two daughters, Phobelien and Arryl.











Pete Frampton



Official status only begins to introduce one of the newest members of the New Jersey Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. When it comes to official, it's hard to top Pete Frampton.

Where to begin.

He has been a NJWOA official 40 years, an NCAA certified official 35 years, and Cadet Supervisor of NJWOA Shore Officials 21 years.

Frampton has officiated more than 2,100 college, high school, middle school and junior meets and tournaments. Within those he has officiated more than 80 high school conference/sectional championships, officiated dual meets in all 21 New Jersey counties, 18 NCAA Division I National Qualifiers, 12 NCAA Division III National Qualifiers, the NCAA Division III National Finals, and the New Jersey state tournament for more than 30 years.

During those years he has also been Chair/Director of the state-wide Garden State Games tournament, and has been on the New Jersey Wrestling Officials Executive Committee 31 years. As a Shore Chapter Executive Officer the past 30 years he has served as president, vice-president and/or treasurer. He also organized and directed a state-wide symposium for state high school wrestling coaches. Away from the sport he has been on the Board of Trustees for The Children's Institute, the Board of Trustees for the Church of Christ, and a member of Employment Horizons on a Development Committee for training the mentally handicapped.

Other organizations he has been involved in include being a board member for the NJSIAA Corporate Committee, the NJSIAA Girls State Tournament, and on the Board of Trustees for CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates for children).

Frampton wrestled in the Garden State for Brick High School and went on to compete at Connecticut before transferring to wrestle at Rider. He graduated in 1980 with a BA in Commerce and later earned an MBA.

Frampton lives in Brick with his wife, Laura. As busy as he is, he owns Jersey Carpet, Tile and Wood in Lavallette.
















































Frnie Monaco



Ernie Monaco has an Edge, and that is plenty enough to welcome him into the New Jersey Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame.

Monaco founded The Edge School of Wrestling in 1984, the first wrestling school of its kind in the country. Over the years he has served

as a member of the New Jersey Coaches Council, coached national teams at the Schoolboy Cadet and Junior levels, as well as recently coaching girls on cadet and junior women's national teams.

The club has helped coach 13 NCAA Division I national champions as well as eight Division I NCAA runners-up, 60 NCAA All-Americans, eight NCAA D-III champions, three World/Olympic team members, 54

National Prep champions, 104 state champions, 77 high school coaches, and 20 members became college coaches, including programs at Columbia, Cornell, Princeton, Oklahoma State and Rutgers.

He is also a member of the Asics Corporation Advisory Board and a USA certified coach.


Monaco, who graduated from Governor Livingston High School in Berkeley Heights, went on to Upsala College and graduated in 1984. He received his state Teacher Certification in Technology Education and Industrial Arts School at Montclair State.

He has been a member of the New Jersey Wrestling Federation Coaches Council where he has been on the executive board. Currently a teacher of technology education at Columbia Middle School in Berkeley Heights, he previously taught at Warren Middle School where he was voted "Teacher of the Year."

Monaco and his wife Marisa live in Annandale. They have son, Ernie Jr., and daughter Chloe.



Ralph Ross



Ralph Ross Sr. is many things, but when it comes to wrestling accomplishments he is simply a legend. And that is why he has entered the New Jersey Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame.

As a high school coach he won more than 600 matches. He has been a school administrator, has won numerous awards and even has a high school athletics complex named after him.

A 1963 graduate of Trenton State College (now The College of New Jersey) Ross began his coaching career at Triton Red High School. The team was 1-5. In the 35 seasons that followed he never had a losing record. Taking the job at Highland High School he would go on to post a record of 601-75-8. Only four New Jersey high school coaches have won more.


He would coach seven individual state champions, 37 Region champions and 140 District champions. His teams won holiday tournaments Maryland, Virginia, Georgia and Florida. His teams won 20 Olympic Conference titles, 20 District titles, 13 South Jersey titles, 10 Group titles and four State titles.

Accolades include a District Coach of the Year, South Jersey Wrestling Coach of the Year, Star-Ledger Coach of the Decade, and in 2000 was named Coach of the Century by the Courier-Post.


Other honors include the NAACP President's Award, entry into the Camden County Hall of Fame, South Jersey Hall of Fame and Highland Regional Hall of Fame. Before his retirement the Board of Education named the Timber Creek football stadium and gymnasium the Ralph E. Ross Athletic Complex.

After retiring from the Black Horse Pike Regional School District in 2010 he was appointed Interim Superintendent of Schools at Deptford Township, then ended his career as Interim Superintendent of Schools in the Monroe Township School District in 2019.

Ross and his wife reside in Sewell. They have four grown children: Lynn; Sandra; Sharon; Ralph Jr., and eight grandchildren.



Richard Scorese



Rich Scorese's nickname could easily be "Champ." The reason would allude to the numerous championships accrued during his wrestling days. Both as a wrestler and a coach.

He won a high school state championship as a senior at Jonathan Dayton in Springfield, going 16-0 in 1955. He accumulated a 46-2

record his last three years while winning three District championships. From there it was on to Bloomsburg College, where in the NAIA nationals he placed second as a sophomore, won nationals as a junior and closed out his senior year an All-American.

Aside from nationals, Scorese was a champion and four-time finalist in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference. Competing for the Elizabeth YMCA he won YMCA Nationals in both Greco-Roman and Freestyle.

In 1960 he won a Regional Olympic Trial at Penn State, and was an alternate on the team after losing in the semis to the eventual Olympic champion Terry McCann of Iowa.

He competed until age 32 while representing the New York Athletic Club.


Between his wrestling accomplishments Scorese served his country in the Marine Corps where he competed as a boxer three years, and also played baseball.

First as an assistant coach at Lock Haven State, in 1969 Scorese went on to be a head coach at Netcong High School, Morris Knolls and Hackettstown. He would coach numerous conference championships, was District Coach of the Year more than once and twice won the Morris County championship. He also experienced the added joy of coaching his son Russ to a state championship.

Scorese also found time to assist at numerous summer camps.

As a result of all his success he has been inducted into the Morris County Hall of Fame, Union County Hall of Fame, Region 3 Hall of Fame and the Bloomsburg University Hall of Fame.

Retired, Rich and his wife Betty reside in Wharton. They have a son, Russ, a daughter, Debbie and five grandchildren.
